Requirements for submission:

- 1) Completed application form (below).
- 2) Original essay, 500 words or less (see instructions below).
- 3) High school transcripts. Official transcripts must be sent from the school(s), postmarked by **April 15, 2020**,

OR

If currently a freshman or sophomore in college, latest college transcript.

- 4) Letter of Documentation of learning challenge(s) which could include a psycho educational or neuropsychological evaluation, copy of an IEP or school learning/accommodation profile, or a letter from a school learning specialist.
- 5) Two letters of recommendation from individuals with knowledge of your abilities in two of these areas: volunteering, paid employment, sports, arts, music, etc. (These letters may be e-mailed.)
- 6) Recent PSAT, SAT, WISC, or other Standardized Test results (if applicable).
